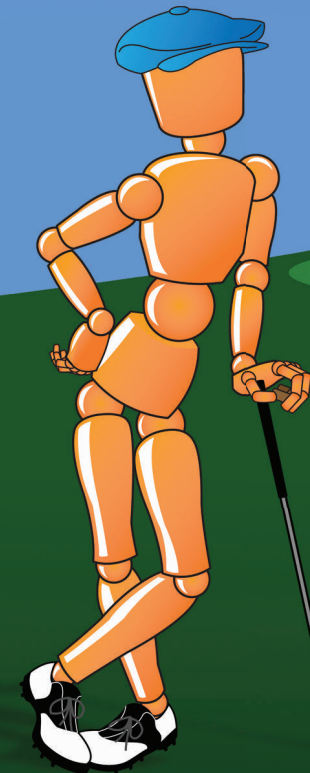

WHY STEM?

Innovation is changing the world around us, and most of the 30 fastest-growing occupations require a background in science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM). Yet according to ChangetheEquation.org, "Business leaders in Florida...cannot find the STEM talent they need to stay competitive."

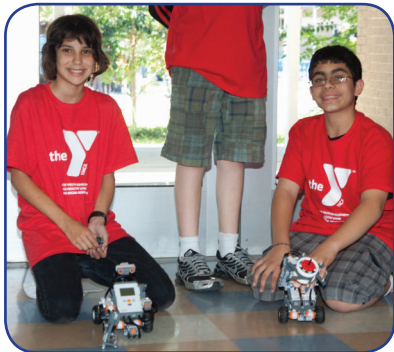
While years of hard work have improved K-12 student performance, the growth is not happening fast enough. In 2009, Florida awarded only 7.7% of college degrees and certificates to STEM fields, compared to 10.7% awarded to STEM fields nationwide.*

To address the national crisis of decreasing college enrollments for science and engineering, Florida is raising the bar by adopting higher math standards for K-12. Through STEM education and outreach programs like U.S. Army PEO STRI High School Engineering Internship and the YMCA Robotics Academy (pictured below), young people are exposed to exciting, hands-on, and mentor-based programs that build science, engineering and technology skills.

We are excited to contribute to the Central Florida STEM Education Council ("CFSEC") again this year. 1. U.S. Army PEO STRI High School Engineering Internship

The U.S. Army PEO STRI High School Engineering Internship introduces students to the concepts of technical evaluations and program management through building of the SeaPerch underwater Remotely Operated Vehicle (ROV). Duffer funds helped the camp buy the kits (a typical cost of \$143 per kit).

2. Central Florida YMCA Summer Camps

The YMCA offers specialty camps to help children focus their passion for the things they love or allow them to explore new ideas. Staff ratios are kept 1:10 and some of the STEM choices include the Aviation Academy and the Robotics Academy. One child's registration costs \$240.
