The National Center for Simulation (NCS) Scholarship and other Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) Initiative Funds

Proceeds from the golf tournament support scholarships to students at the University of Central Florida (UCF) and ten (10) high schools in Orange and Seminole Counties. In addition, funds raised at this event support STEM Initiatives that benefit both middle and high school programs throughout Central Florida.

The Vince and Beth Amico Scholarship (\$2,500) is offered in the fall and spring semesters at UCF to incoming freshmen who show an interest in STEM-focused careers or to graduate students pursuing Master's or Doctoral Degrees in Simulation from UCF's Institute for Simulation & Training (IST).

The Hank Okraski Scholarship (\$1,000) is awarded to Orange and Seminole County high school seniors annually who have been involved and excelled in specialized STEM programs at their schools

Lou Frey Institute at the University of Central Florida

Seldom in the history of our nation has there been a greater need for the people of the United States to fully understand American foundational documents and principles, the workings of their government, and the mechanisms through which they can and should participate and effect change.

Inspired by the vision and leadership of Congressman Lou Frey, Jr., a veteran, attorney, public servant, and civics-education advocate, the nonpartisan Lou Frey Institute (LFI) at the University of Central Florida (UCF) is dedicated to strengthening civic life in Florida through civics-education programs delivered via the state's K-12 schools. LFI encourages thoughtful, productive debate by instilling a thorough and robust civic knowledge of our Constitution, levels and branches of government, political parties, and methods for civil and productive engagement with government and fellow citizens.

WHY SHOULD WE CARE? Because Florida citizens are among the least involved in the nation. Because we rank 48th in volunteering, 50th in attending public meetings and 49th in voting in local elections. And because our young people are disconnecting from civic life: in January 2017, 35% of Millennials said they were losing faith in American democracy, and just 25% were confident in the democratic system.

Our focus is on the next generation of citizens and those we trust to educate them...to give teachers the tools and students the knowledge and skills that results in informed, active citizenship.
